MINUTES - Representative Assembly Meeting

Wednesday, May 10, 2023

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by the President, Nicole Disney-Bates, at Severna Park High School, at 5:11 p.m.

ACTION ITEMS

<u>Hybrid Work Group</u> - President Disney-Bates reported that in the folder is a flow chart on Hybrid Voting. She stated that this is a summary of what the Hybrid Work Group found on Hybrid Voting. She reviewed the options and the pros and cons.

It was moved by Brendan Maltese, seconded by Amy Hussey, to close debate. The motion was approved.

Cathy Flanders called for a Division Vote.

It was moved by Allison Brewer, seconded by Richard Benfer, to move to Hybrid Voting. The motion was approved with 33-Yes, 24-No, 5-Abstentions.

It was moved by Kristi Davies, seconded by Alex Tougas, to extend the meeting if necessary. The motion was approved.

<u>Proposed Bylaws</u> - Geoff Turk, representing the Bylaws Committee, read the amendments to the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES - Section 4 - the proposed amendment is to add "TAAAC members elected to the Board of Directors or officers shall not serve as a voting member of the Bylaws Committee. Elected Board members or officers may be appointed by the President to serve in a non-voting, advisory role to the committee."

Mr. Turk shared the rationale.

Debate closes. The amendment to ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES - Section 4 passes.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES - Section 6 - the proposed amendment is to add to the second sentence after chairperson "(s) or chair/vice-chair in order to best serve the needs of the operations of the committee."

Debate closes. The amendment to ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES - Section 6 passes.

ARTICLE IV - REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY - the proposed amendment is to add "Section 9. TAAAC leadership shall provide all action items and agenda items in writing to building representatives no later than 5 calendar days prior to the Representative Assembly in which a

vote will take place. This would include, but not be limited to, the language and rationale for NBIs, Standing Rules, and position statements in which the building representatives will be required to cast a vote. Bylaw amendments will be presented in accordance with Article XIX Section 2."

Will Johnson stated that he has an amendment to the amended Bylaws. He would like to add "pre-filed" after all in the first sentence and add "pre-filed" before NBIs. Debate closes. The amendment with the added amendment to ARTICLE IV - REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY passes.

Nicole Disney-Bates presented Membership Awards for Top Activist and Highest Membership Growth.
