# **MINUTES - Representative Assembly Meeting**

Wednesday, April 17, 2024

### CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by the Vice President, Kristina Korona, at Severna Park Middle School, at 5:10 p.m.

Review TAAAC Budget with BOD Liaisons - The Proposed FY'25 TAAAC Budget was shared with the Representatives along with an explanation. We will be voting on the budget in June. The main thing is that we have enough funds to hire a new staff member. On May 22, 2024, there will be a Budget Hearing by Zoom to ask questions.

Mike Magee reported on the next steps in the budget process. County Executive Pittman's budget comes out May 1, 2024.

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#### EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR UPDATE

<u>Career Ladder Update</u> - Executive Director Soares reported that we have a tentative agreement on the Career Ladder. The Career Ladder will go into the contract once it is voted on. It must be submitted by July 2024 and will go into effect July 2025. The levels of the Career Ladder were reviewed.

Executive Director Soares reported that TAAAC will be starting an annual event called Leadership Development Conference. It will be a two-day event. This will be a major PAC fund raiser. There will be workshops offered. He stated that we are looking for donations.
